Ramon George Kitto 7 April 1934 to 15 March 2016

Sadly, Ray Kitto our Welfare Officer has died. Stewart, Gillian, Trudy and Colin attended a moving funeral service for



Ray on 4 April. It was a very full church and Ray's coffin was led by a server carrying his Policeman's helmet, covered with the police flag and bore a single red rose and his Long Service police medal. Ray was a devout Churchman and led a life dedicated to helping us all, particularly children and old aged pensioners. In his youth he served for a brief time in Chatham Dockyards and was there when HMS LONDON returned in 1949 after the Yangtze Incident. He joined the RAF and served in the RAF Ceremonial Drill squad which performed all over the UK including at the Cenotaph. After completing National Service with the RAF, Ray joined the police and served his full 22 years. Ray served with the scouts, helped at Darby and Joan Clubs, driving for disabled children and many other social support organisations. As the AMETHYST Association Welfare Officer he did a wonderful job telephoning widows and those in ill health to keep them in touch with the Association

With Pat, Ray had two children, a disabled son who died young and a daughter who predeceased him. He leaves Grandchildren and Great Grandchildren.
